Hawthorn

There are two main parts to the leaf of a tree. The green part itself – the BLADE. The stalk which attaches it to the tree – the PETIOLE. A SIMPLE leaf has just a BLADE and a PETIOLE.

A COMPOUND leaf has several LEAFLETS attached to a PETIOLE.

Know Your Leaves!

COMPOUND leaves can have all the LEAFLETS attached to a single point at the top of the PETIOLE as in the HORSE CHESTNUT.

Or there can be PAIRS of LEAFLETS with one leaf at the top of the PETIOLE as in ROWAN, ASH and ELDER

SIMPLE leaves can be LOBED like the HAWTHORN and OAK or have SEVERAL POINTS like SYCAMORE and MAPLE.


They can have PRICKLY edges like HOLLY or TOOTHED edges like BIRCH, HAZEL, ALDER and CHERRY or indeed the edges may be completely SMOOTH as in BEECH.
